Grade 12 TVR Assembly (Apr 5)

Nowruz – Iranian (Persian) New Year (Mar 19)

Iranian or Persian New Year. It begins on the spring equinox and marks the beginning of Farvardin, the first month of the Solar Hijri calendar.

<u>International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination (Mar 21)</u>

A United Nations day of remembrance and action. Observed annually on the day that 69 people lost their lives to the hands of the police in Sharpeville, South Africa, while demonstrating peacefully against apartheid "pass laws" in 1960.

Purim (Judaism – Mar 23-24)

A Jewish celebration that is a lively festival that commemorates back in the 4th century BC, when Jewish people were saved from a death decree according to the book of Esther.

Hola Mohalla (Sikhism – Mar 25-27)

A colourful 3-day Sikh festival celebrated during spring.

Holi (Hinduism – Mar 25)

A Hindu festival that celebrates spring, colour, and love.
