Course Changes

Please be aware that the Timetable (as it is every year), is incredibly tight. We go to great lengths to ensure that students get what they asked for in the Spring (when the Timetable is built-based upon what students told us they wanted to take). If a student changes their mind or did not take a course in the summer that they had originally planned to, it can be very difficult to make changes to schedules. When students get their Timetables, they will be given instructions about how to make Course Correction Requests. These Corrections are only to be completed if a student has an incorrect course, is programmed into the wrong grade level, or has a gap in their schedules. Counsellors will be working feverishly to make as many corrections as they can, but not everything will be possible, and we ask that all families remain patient and follow the schedule they were given until they have been advised of a change.

11:00am to 11:30am Mini School Assembly - **Mini School students are also expected to

attend their Grade Assembly at the appropriate time listed above.**

Most importantly, do not share your combination with anyone else. The lock you will be provided with is yours to keep. There is a charge of \$10.00 for the lock, but you will not have to return it to us.

Marlinaires, Mentors and teachers will be available in the halls to assist students new to the school. Homeroom lists will be published and placed on the window at the front of the school at the end of the day. Students will be able to find their homeroom by looking through the list to find their name (listed alphabetically by last name), then cross-referencing their Homeroom, ie: 9A, 9B, 9C, etc., with the room number list next to the student name list.

Homerooms - September 7th-9th

We will have a brief **homeroom class each morning** for the first week of classes to provide students with



relevant information and obtain accurate attendance figures. Each homeroom teacher will also review the school expectations and procedures, distribute agendas, and answer ongoing questions students may have.

It is very important that you attend this homeroom class each day. If you do not attend homeroom during the early days of the school year, your home will be phoned. If we are unable to contact you, we will assume you are attending another school and you will be withdrawn from McNair.

Fee Statements



We will **NOT** be mailing home fee statements as they will be accessible to families for viewing and paying online. If you have not already done so, please create an account (+ click on 'yes' to receive

notifications) and register your student(s) at https://richmondsd38.schoolcashonline.com

At this time, you will see a School Fee (\$28) and options to purchase workbooks or supplies for a few courses. Other Fees such as the Yearbook and Grad related fees will be added in the following months. You will receive notifications via School Cash once these fees have been assigned to students.

Meet the Teacher

You will be able to meet your son or daughter's teachers on the evening of **Thursday**, **September 22nd**. The evening begins with a Welcome in the gym at **7:00pm** followed by an opportunity to meet your child's teachers in their classrooms. More information regarding this evening will be sent home in September.



Work Habits

Attitudes toward learning, cooperation, attendance, punctuality, and the ability to work well with others are very important aspects of effective learning. At McNair, we value work habits. Student work habits are reported on all interim reports:

Forms to submit to school office

Students and parents received their **Media Release form and Walking Field Trip form via an email**. Please ensure it is printed off, signed and returned to Homeroom teachers by Friday, September 9th so your child's photograph can be displayed in the Yearbook etc.

We will also be sending home a **Student Information Verification/Medical Form** with your child on Tuesday, September 6th. Please ensure that the Student Information Verification Form is filled out with current, accurate, information. Please be sure to include the name and number of an alternate contact who speaks English. **Please make any changes directly onto the form and return to your child's Homeroom teacher by September 9th. <u>Please be sure to include an accurate email address.</u>**

Protect Personal belongings

The best defense against acts of theft is to not bring valuable items to school. Protect your belongings and do not leave money or other valuables in an unattended bag, locker or changing room. Students should **LEAVE VALUABLES AT HOME!**



Academic Honesty

We believe that every student has the responsibility to participate actively in their own learning, When faced with problems to solve or assignments to complete, it is the thinking and the effort a student puts into researching, reading, writing and re-writing that allows one to truly learn.

Similarly, submitting the work of another student, tutor, parent, friend, etc. as your own work (even though it has been properly footnoted and referenced) is plagiarism and not acceptable at school. This applies equally to written work and projects (ie: Web design, tech projects, art work, and photos). Tutors should not write, re-write or significantly edit large sections of work for a student. It is the student's responsibility to avoid deliberate or accidental plagiarism and to verify and account for all of their own work and learning.

The Pride of Vancouver cruises around beautiful English Bay and a buffet dinner will be provided followed by lots of dancing with our DJ. Don't forget, there are beautiful views to take in!!

The cruise will **depart at 6:30pm sharp**. Please note that we cannot wait for latecomers. The boat returns at the **dock for 9:30pm**.

Students are responsible for transportation to and from the boat. Give yourself lots of time to get there as traffic downtown is busy in the evening. If you are driving, pay parking is available near the marina. Please make sure you have a safe plan to return home.

As this is a school function, all school rules apply. To make sure everyone is safe on board, students will be checked prior to boarding by the security staff of the charter boat company. Please do not bring any food or beverages nor any items that are not appropriate for a school function.

Lockers and Agendas

All students will be issued a **locker** by their Homeroom teacher during first week of school. You are welcome to bring in your own lock, but you will need to record your combination with your Homeroom teacher. If you do not have a lock, we are selling them. **All students can order the lock online at SchoolCashOnline for \$10**. Always use your locker to keep from carrying books that are too heavy, and alsfo be sure to keep it clean. To ensure the safety of your belongings, always use your locker for anything valuable (do not bring money or electronics to the Gym Change rooms), and **do not share your locker combination with ANYONE!**

Hard-copies Agendas will be available for students who need them (including all Grade 8s), but we have created an app called

MySchoolDay App for students (and parents) to use on their phones and other devices. We will review how to use and download the app during the Grade Assemblies, but we want to encourage everyone (including parents) to use the app to help you stay organized and informed!

School Supplies

We recommend that students wait until they have met with each of their teachers before purchasing too many school supplies or equipment. Students should, however, bring **a pen, a binder and some paper** for the first few days of school. The information will come to you quickly, so you will need to stay organized. Some courses may use a workbook which will be confirmed by the teacher and can be purchased at SchoolCashOnline.

School and Grad Photos

McNair is having its school photographs on **Wednesday**, **September 28**th. This photo will be used on student Go-Cards and parents will have the option to purchase packages of the photos. Information on the packages will come from *Artona*. Photo retake day will be on **Wednesday**, **October 26**th, for anyone unhappy with their photo or for those who were absent on the first day.



Formal Graduation Photos will also be taken by **Artona** and they will be bringing a trailer to the school parking lot **November 27**th – **December 3**rd. Graduates will have to make an appointment, dress the part and be **ready to take the photo that parents will want to buy and is used on the** Graduation Composite. Early Warning Phone Line

McNair appreciates all communication from home about students and families. In order to keep us aware of students who will be absent from school, we ask that parents use the **EARLY WARNING LINE** at **(604) 295-6427**. This number is accessible 7 days a week, 24 hours a day. Please report your child's absence by calling McNair on this number. Thank you in advance.

Collaboration Days

Collaboration time is where students get to sleep in while teachers meet and plan new activities and lesson ideas for their classes. Collaboration time is not new to McNair (we have been doing it for 6 years), and happens the **first Wednesday of each month** (starting September 15th). Collaboration Time runs from 8:30-9:55 and classes will start at 10:00 on these days. Students coming in from Hamilton will be advised of alternate bus times. End of day dismissal on all of these days is unchanged at 3:00 PM (see below for exact time).

Bell Schedules

McNair is a semester school, with 4 classes per day and most students (except Grade 8s) will have those 4 classes every day until the end of January, when they will get 4 new classes in next semester. We have three different schedules, but the order of the

Teen Mental Health

Learning Centre Help

McNair is continuing with its Learning Resource Centre model. Students are now welcome to attend the Resource centre on a drop-in basis during class time, provided they have permission from their classroom teacher. Any student who is in need of some extra assistance in a subject area may come to the Resource Centre to get assistance from the teachers in the room. Similarly, we have also created an opportunity for students to access this assistance at lunch and after school. Mr. McLellan is a Math/Science specialist, is available to help students during our lunch hour two days per week or until about 3:45 afterschool three days per week. If your child can benefit from this extra assistance, please remind them to advocate for themselves and take advantage of this tremendous support. It is open to all students and if you want to know if your child is utilizing it, we have a check in and check out system that tracks who is accessing the system. If interested, please check with Mr. McLellan to see which days he will be available at lunch, and which days after school.

Athletics

McNair has long had a very proud tradition of Athletics and next year promises to be another strong season full of opportunities for young student-athletes. Being connected to school teams is a great way to meet new friends and enjoy fabulous coaching and have lots of fun competing against other school from around Richmond. Be sure to listen to the announcements so you are aware of upcoming practices and try-outs. The fall season gets started right away, so be sure you listen to the announcements so you are aware of the upcoming practices and tryouts.

Attendance/Early Dismissal

Attendance is taken in each class during the day. If a student is absent first period and the school has not been notified, the school WILL phone students in Grades 8-12. If a student misses a later class, you MAY get a call from a classroom teacher, administrator or Counsellor to find out why he/she was absent. Recorded messages are also sent home at noon and at the end of the day, alerting parents to any class missed by their child via the school attendance system. Regular attendance is necessary for successful learning. If students need to leave the school during the day, please send them to the office with a note, signed by a parent, indicating when they should be dismissed. **Students MUST sign out at the office before he/she leaves, either with a note or phone call from a parent.**

Calendar

All students will be receiving a **Wall Calendar** on the first day of class. The calendar has lots of information about events in the school (Report Cards, Semester change-over, Exams, Grad events and holidays). Please be sure to use this tool, along with the **Student Agenda or MySchoolDay App** in order to stay informed and connected to the events in the school. Grade 8 and Resource students will be given a Paper version of the Student agenda if they want one.

Pick Up/Drop Off

Help us make McNair a safe school and a good neighbor by doing what you can to ease the traffic congestion in the area. Number 4 Road can be very busy and we encourage parents and all other drivers not to enter the parking lot from the North side of the building. We also encourage students to walk or bike to school. If you **MUST** pick up or drop off, please do so before 8:00 AM and do not stop in the parking lot, rather proceed to the drop off area in front of the school.

Vaping/Smoking

Smoking is a serious health hazard and student and adults are **NOT PERMITTED** to smoke anywhere on school property. We encourage healthy habits at McNair and will actively dissuade students found smoking in areas where they are not permitted.

Cellphones/Devices

Cellphones and other electronic devices are not to be used, seen or heard during class time, unless permission has been granted by the classroom teacher. These can be very valuable learning tools, but they need to be used appropriately, and must not become a distraction. We ask that parents DO NOT call or text your child while they are in class. In case of emergency, please call the school office at (604) 668-6575 and we will contact your child for you.
