Student Accounts (MS Teams and MyEdBC)

All McNair Secondary students have been issued credentials to access SD38 district accounts for **MS Teams** and **MyEducation BC**. Students will have received an email from the school district providing them with a new student login name (username) to access computer labs, Office 365, and Microsoft Teams. (Note: MyEducation BC login information remains unchanged.). It is very important that all McNair students have access to these digital platforms and tools. For MS Teams, please contact any subject teacher for username and password reset. If you have difficulty logging in to MyEducation BC website, please contact the office for password reset.











• **MS Teams** is the communication and collaboration platform that many RHS teachers will use for class communication, sharing class materials and resources, video conferencing, collaborative work, and file storage. Students will have access to the Office Apps (Word, Excel, PowerPoint, OneNote, etc.) while at school and at home, and will be provided with secure personal file storage within OneDrive.

• MyEducation BC is the platform students and parents use to access schedules, attendance, report cards, transcript information, and much more. Students and parent each have an account with their own login credentials.

Terry Fox Run

McNair Secondary School once again honoured a great Canadian hero by participating in the Terry Fox Run last Tuesday, September 27th. Terry Fox was an 18-year-old student at SFU when he lost his leg to cancer. He decided to raise awareness and funds by running across Canada, the equivalent of a full marathon a day, on one leg. His Marathon of Hope covered over 3,000 miles



when he had to stop as the cancer returned. Terry Fox passed away at the age of 22, yet his remarkable story continues to inspire Canada and the world. All students and staff travelled through our neighbourhood and were running or walking together on September 27th. Students from our Athletic Council collected money and students were asked to bring a small donation, if they were able. Teen Mental Health

Please be sure to communicate with your child about how they are feeling and if you need some help, please contact our Counsellors. Being a

teenager has never been filled with more pressure and we need to be aware of the signals if our kids are struggling.

Learning Centre Help

McNair is continuing with its Learning Resource Centre model. Students are now welcome to attend the Resource centre on a drop-in basis during class time, provided they have permission from their classroom teacher. Any student who is in need of some extra assistance in a subject area may come to the Resource Centre to get assistance from the teachers in the room. Similarly, we have also created an opportunity for students to access this assistance at lunch and after school. Mr. McLellan is a Math/Science specialist, is available to help students during our lunch hour two days per week or until about 3:45 afterschool three days per week. If your child can benefit from this extra assistance, please remind them to advocate for themselves and take advantage of this tremendous support. It is open to all students and if you want to know if your child is utilizing it, we have a check in and check out system that tracks who is accessing the system. If interested, please check with Mr. McLellan to see which days he will be available at lunch, and which days after school.

GRADE 12s

Student Transcripts Service (STS)

Grade 12 students should set this up ASAP. That way, one step in the post-secondary application is completed. The STS is an online application for students to view marks, scholarships, transcripts and have transcripts sent automatically to post-secondary institutions and third parties. To access the service, visit the Ministry of Education's *Order Transcripts and Certificates* website at <u>https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/education-training/k-12/support/transcripts-and-certificates</u> Follow the instructions found there.

Most applications at colleges and universities are now open or opening very soon. Students either apply directly to the school or use a Provincial post-secondary application service. (Note: Most institutions use an application service; otherwise, it will be clearly indicated on their website.) Students need their 9-digit P.E.N. number and must pay by credit card.
