Transfers

Richmond students wishing to transfer to a non-catchment school must apply by filling out a Transfer Application form (see <u>https://sd38.bc.ca/student-registration/transfer-applications</u>). The form



must be submitted to the requested school beginning Monday, February 6th, 2023. The deadline



for **Round 1 school transfer applications** on Thursday, **February 28th**, **2023**. Applications received at the requested school may be approved to attend, based on the criteria established by the Richmond School District (published on the form). **Transfer decisions** will be communicated to parents/legal guardians on Tuesday, **March 7th**, **2023** via email. If parents wish to submit a transfer complaint, they can do so by submitting a completed Transfer Complaint Form. Details can be found in the district website at <u>https://sd38.bc.ca</u>.

Student Accounts (MS Teams and MyEdBC)

All McNair Secondary, students have been issued credentials to access SD38 district accounts for **MS Teams** and **MyEducation BC**. Students will have received an email from the school district providing them with a new student login name (username) to access computer labs, Office 365, and Microsoft Teams. (Note: MyEducation BC login information remains unchanged.). It is very important that all McNair students have access to these digital platforms and tools. For MS Teams, please contact any subject teacher for username and password reset. If you have difficulty logging in to MyEducation BC website, please contact the office for password reset.

• **MS Teams** is the communication and collaboration platform that many teachers will use for class communication, sharing class materials and resources, video conferencing, collaborative work, and file storage. Students will have access to the Office Apps (Word, Excel, PowerPoint, OneNote, etc.) while at school and at home, and will be provided with secure personal file storage within OneDrive.

• MyEducation BC is the platform students and parents use to access schedules, attendance, report cards, transcript information, and much more. Students and parent each have an account with their own login credentials.



In-House Butchery Demo



Columbus Meat Market is an authentic butcher shop located on Nanaimo Street in East Vancouver. It is owned by the Masi family, who have been in the meat industry for three generations. **Giuseppe Masi** first opened a butcher shop in Castelgrande, Basilicata, Italy in 1954 and the family eventually moved to Vancouver. Brothers Eugenio, Giancarlo, and Vito Masi purchased Columbus Meat Market in 1991 and have been faithfully serving customers since then.

I have been shopping there for a few years and recently on a Saturday morning visit, I asked one of

the owners whether they would be open to doing a butchery demonstration in our kitchen and after some discussion, they agreed to send veteran butcher Austin Woo.

On Wednesday, January 18th, the McNair Culinary Arts students and staff were delighted to welcome



Austin and Damiano Masi from Columbus Meats to our teaching kitchen. They brought a side of veal to break down for our classes, and as the students gathered around and started taking photos, Austin arranged the large pieces of veal on the table. Damiano introduced the business to the classes and shared their vision of providing the best service that places the needs of the customer above all else and building and assisting community. As a customer, I can attest to their attention to detail and their top-notch service.

Austin proceeded to break down the side of veal deftly and the students were captivated by the demonstration and talk. The students asked thoughtful questions, and some were very eager to purchase various cuts of meat for incredibly reasonable prices. Afterwards, Austin and Damiano expressed how surprisingly engaging and fun the experience had been for them...a definite win-win for both of us! We can't wait to invite Austin again for another butchery demonstration. They'll have to bring two sides next time though! Thanks again, Columbus Meat Market, for making this happen. In the days leading up to McNair's Open House, the Culinary Arts teaching kitchen was abuzz with activity. We hadn't had the opportunity to showcase the amazing savoury and sweet items that we produce for several years, so this year's Open House was extra special. We were especially excited to introduce **Red Seal Chef Jen Rutherford**, who joined us in September and brought with her a wealth of experience from the Fairmont Hotel. Chef Jen, the lovely and talented **Food Services Aide Gurdev Singh** (fondly known as Mama G), cheery and engaging **Cold Food Services Aide/Cashier Bev Acheson** and

Culinary Arts teacher Ms. Ho worked alongside two blocks of eager students ranging from Grade 9 to 12 to prepare food for likely four hundred guests.

On the evening of January 26th, after a full day of preparations, we were delighted to welcome a crew of 23 student volunteers (including two former graduates) to help us set up, prep, and serve the following house-made items:

- potstickers filled with pork and cabbage
- deep fried house-made wontons served with sweet chili sauce
- vegetarian spring rolls
- mini cheese or pepperoni pizzas
- hummus with vegetable crudités
- sushi
- arancini with tomato sauce
- bite-sized vegetable quiches with cheese

- mini pulled pork sandwiches on house-made buns with coleslaw

- mushroom and goat cheese ravioli with fried garlic and sage
- mini roast beef crostini with horseradish cream
- petite browned butter chocolate chip cookies
- petite ginger molasses cookies









It was great to be able to share with the school community what I love about this program: that it is only one of two Culinary Arts Programs in the Richmond School District, that students who choose this elective (starting in Grade 9 and upwards) have the opportunity to obtain their **Foodsafe certificates** for a fraction of the price that it costs elsewhere; that this fun elective provides students with opportunities to learn and grow and develop vocational skills

Some highlights of the evening were watching student volunteers run the pasta action station, hearing the glowing comments from all the happy attendees, and seeing the student volunteers having so much fun running around serving food, replenishing platters, talking amongst themselves and to parents and friends as they worked, and everyone having a wonderful time of connection as they were enjoying the delicious food.

McNair Open House (Jan 26)

Our students and staff were situated all around the school showcasing many of the great things our students and staff are teaching, learning, and engaged in. **Grade 8-11** students and parents received Program Planning information for all students who will be returning to McNair in September 2023. This event has been hugely successful and displayed all the reasons why this school is such a wonderful place to learn.

Learning Centre Help

McNair is continuing with its Learning Resource Centre model. Students are now welcome to attend the **Resource centre on a drop-in basis during class time**, provided they have permission from their classroom teacher. Any student who is in need of some extra assistance in a subject area may come to the Resource Centre to get assistance from the teachers in the room. Similarly, we have also





created an opportunity for students to access this assistance at lunch and after school. **Mr. McLellan** is a Math/Science specialist, is available to help students during our **lunch hour two days per week or until about 3:45 afterschool three days per week**. If your child can benefit from this extra assistance, please remind them to advocate for themselves and take advantage of this tremendous support. It is open to all students and if you want to know if your child is utilizing it, we have a check in and check out system that tracks who is accessing the system. If interested, please check with Mr. McLellan to see which days he will be available at lunch, and which days after school.

GRADE 12s

Grade 12 students should have finalized their post-secondary applications. Make sure applications are received by the institution's stated deadlines.

Offers of Admission: Grade 12 students who have applied to a university/college for entry in September are reminded to check the institution's secured student service (student account) website/portal for new messages regularly. Many sites require students to use the Identification Number that was noted on their confirmation letter along with a password. These sites contain important details regarding: transcript submission, self-reporting, admission offers, course pre-requisites, registration, deadline dates, contact information, grades

Student Transcripts Service (STS)

Students must register with STS in order to for the post-secondary schools they are applying to, to access their marks. Students need their PEN number to register.

To access the service, visit the Ministry of Education's *Order Transcripts and Certificates* website at **www.StudentTranscripts.gov.bc.ca** and follow the instructions found there.

1. **Register for a BCeID** (a BC Government account that provides you with access to B.C. Government online services)

- 2. Register for the StudentTranscript Service using your BCeID
- 3. Log in to your StudentTranscripts Service using your BCeID.
- 4. Follow the steps in order to have transcripts sent electronically to post-
- secondary institutions.

*Note: Some Post-secondary institutions may require your grade information earlier than available through this process. Ensure you are familiar with each institution's requirements regarding grade submission

Register to write the TOEFL and/or the IELTS required to do so. Many universities recommend you submit your results early. Contact the Career Centre or the individual post-secondary institutions you are applying to for requirements, exemptions and how to register.

DEADLINES

Many universities & colleges require additional information such as transcripts or supplemental applications or profiles, this is called a "document deadline". This is separate from the application deadline and varies depending on the institution. Please check each institution's website for details.

MAR 1/23 – KPU application deadline for limited enrollment programs For all schools - Be sure to check:

• application deadlines

- scholarship deadlines
- housing and document deadlines

Deadline dates vary so check carefully!

Students may log-in to their university account and report their interim marks for the following BC institutions:

SFU – Self-reporting portal opens JAN 3/23 closes MAR 31/23

Self reporting for Beedie Business– FEB 7/23 as well as the deadline to submit the supplemental application <u>https://www.sfu.ca/students/admission/apply/applied/fall.html</u>

UBC – No longer require students to self-report directly. However students must have completed their STS forms by Jan 31 for UBC to gain permission to access marks from the BC Ministry of Education. **FEB 15/23** – deadline to submit English Language Admission Standard (ELAS) such as IELTS or TOEFL

UVic - FEB 15/23 - MAR 15/23 - (In order to be considered for UVic's entrance scholarships based on marks alone, students must self-report their Grade 12 marks, no separate application is required. https://www.uvic.ca/undergraduate/admissions/how-to-apply/self-report-your-grades/index.php There are also scholarships that have other criteria;

CapU – Self-reporting no longer required, but students need to complete STS forms.

Langara College – no self reporting - students should attend an information session on programs that are of interest. <u>http://langara.ca/news-and-events/information-sessions/index.html</u>
