Canadian Scholastic Achievement League's Grade 8 Scholastic Challenge 2023 Results

Something to Celebrate!!!

McNair's Grade 8 class of 2022-2023 continued our twenty-one year tradition of participating in the Canadian Scholastic Achievement League's Grade 8 Scholastic Challenge 2023. Earlier this spring approximately 5000 knowledgeable Grade 8s from all parts of Canada competed. The challenge consisted of 100 questions on a wide variety of topics that must be completed within 60 minutes.

This year's top national score was an outstanding 91% and the national average was 50%. Ninety-seven McNair Grade 8s participated and 38 of our students scored at the national average or better. Our McNair School Champions are Jenna Bevan and Daphne Yuen who both scored 73%. Second, and also tied with a score of 66%, are Joshua Chow and Charlie Ford, and third is Brianna Apreutesei with 65%.

Theatre McNair is also very proud to announce that **next years' Spring Production** will be (cue drumroll)... **The Addams Family** — **The Musical!**


