McNair Flex Time (Sign-up is required)

Each day, we allocate instructional time for "self-directed" personalized learning. During Flex Time, students engage in independent learning and pursue their learning with the support and mentorship of teachers. This approach empowers students with choice and ownership of their learning, while our staff members facilitate a supportive learning environment.

- Flex Time is Self-Directed, Self-Managed, and Self-Regulated
- Flex Time Enhances Curricular and Core Competency Development
- Flex Time Builds on Individual Passions
- Flex Time supports Self-Care, Self-Awareness, Physical/Mental Health

Flex Time Sign Up Procedures

To guarantee classroom space for all students and to help students plan for the effective use of their flex time, all students must sign up in advance for each day's flex time. To sign up, students visit menair.myweeklyplanner.net and sign in with their student number. Students may choose any of their current teachers and must enter their plan/goal for each day. At the end of each week, we will email parents a summary of how their child made use of Flex Time.

Professional Development Day: Indigenous Focus

September 20nd is the first Professional Development Day of the 2024-2025 school year. This day is an opportunity for educators at McNair and across Richmond to engage in professional learning activities with a focus on acquiring new skills and knowledge to better support students.
