"Curiosity may put the brain in a state that allows it to learn and retain any kind of information, like a vortex that sucks in what you are motivated to learn, and also everything around it."

Humans are naturally curious, especially children. We are born with an instinctual desire to seek new information and experiences. Curiosity is a person's willingness and desire to learn new things and dig deeper than the surface. In education, curiosity makes learning a much more natural process, rather than just a meaningless task or assignment.

When we're curious, we're more willing and interested in acquiring knowledge and "therein lies the rub." As we age and gain more experience, we become less reliant on curiosity for answers and more reliant on knowledge. Curiosity gives way to comfort and certainty.

Research has shown that curiosity is associated with higher levels of positive emotions, lower levels of anxiety, greater satisfaction with life, and better psychological well-being. Curiosity is linked so closely to success because it drives you into the unknown, where you make discoveries, develop relationships, uncover opportunities, and experience growth.

While curiosity alone does not always lead to success in schools, relationships, and life, it's a good place to start. Curiosity is a skill and should be nurtured and practiced. Educators can foster a child's curiosity through pedagogical techniques, such as how we respond to students' questions. We can create learning experiences that spark curiosity by embracing uncertainty, slowing down and going deeper. We can encourage reading, work on listening and observation skills, help students develop portfolios, and use project-based learning.

Every day, there are knowledge and experiences waiting to be collected and pieced together. If given the opportunity, curiosity can be a powerful tool in our classrooms, in our school, and in our community. *Championing Students and Their Learning*
