BC Graduation Numeracy Assessments (GNA 10)

The Numeracy Assessment is not a typical "math test" and will include 24 common questions and a student choice section (answer 2 of 4). The questions will be context-based problems that students will read, think about, and present a solution. The GNA measures 5 numeracy processes, including students' abilities to INTERPRET, APPLY, SOLVE, ANALYZE and COMMUNICATE solutions. The GNA is not attached to any course but reported separately using a 4-point scale (1. Emerging; 2. Developing; 3. Proficient; 4. Extending)
