McNair's First Annual Reconciliation Walk

On Monday, Sept 29th, we will walk together in Truth and Reconciliation. It means remembering the painful truths of our shared history and choosing, every day, to do better. Along our Reconciliation walking route, signs invite reflection on the past, present, and future—centering on the experiences of the Musqueam people. These markers are not just reminders; they are calls to listen, to learn, and to honour. Students and staff will gather in the main gym for a Land Acknowledgement and at 12:20pm, we begin our walk through the community, reflecting on the legacy of Residential Schools and their lasting impact. We encourage everyone to dress appropriately for the weather, as we walk together in remembrance, respect, and hope.
